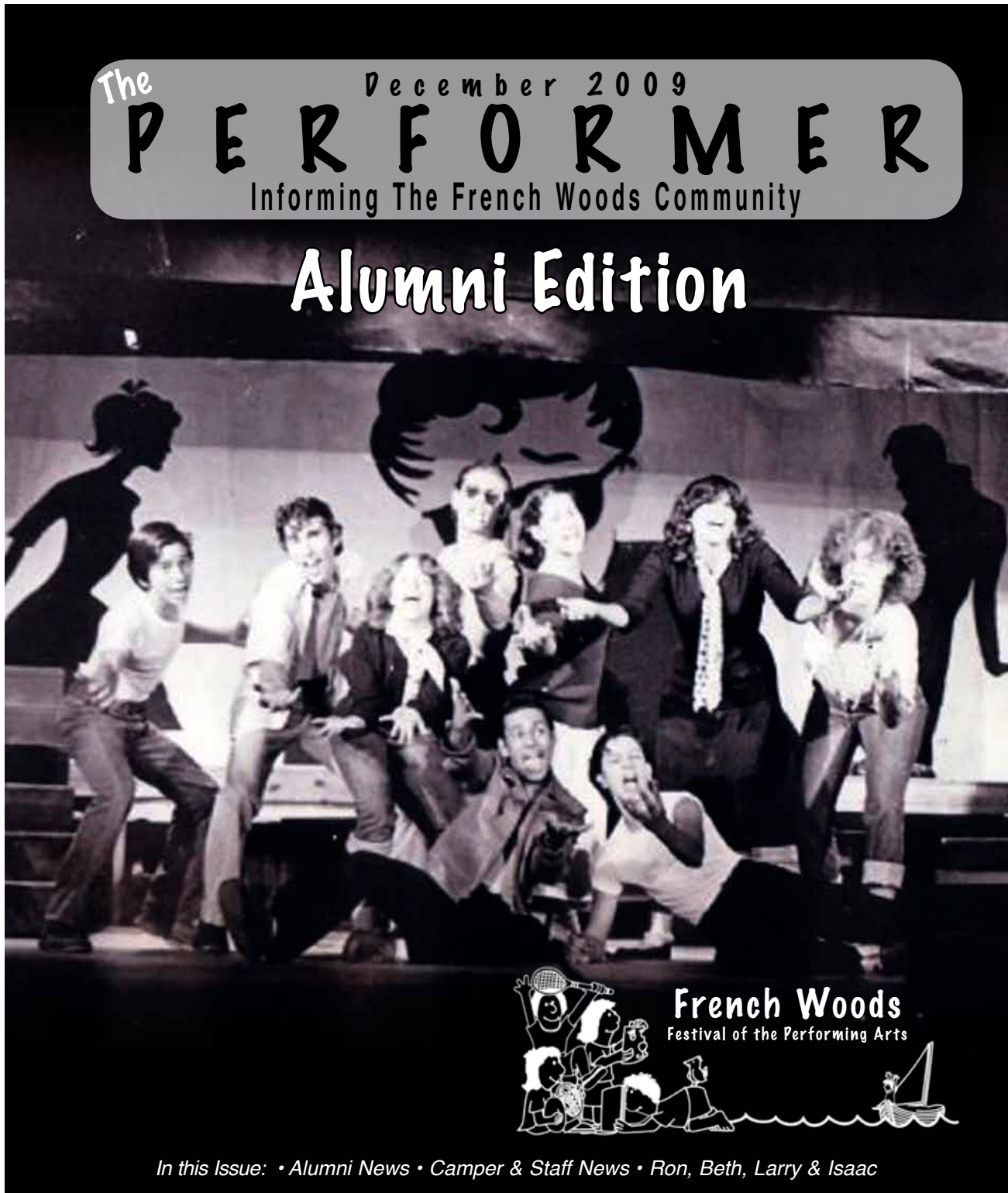

Melissa Errico is playing the role of Betty Haynes in Irving Berlin's *White Christmas* at the Marquis Theater on Broadway.

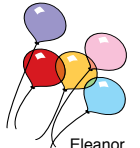

Isaac's Corner

There are now just 190 days until session one. Camp is around the corner and we are all so excited. Below you will find an article about French Woods and the reasons for its success and the benefits FWF brings to our campers and their families.

For many campers at French Woods, a creative arts camp is the only place they can go to pursue their passions, take risks, and have the time to actually learn the craft required to be creative and "make art." Though it sounds obvious to say it, French Woods may be the only place in their lives where they are really trusted as creative and performing artists.

I have probably known many different types of camps: all-around camps, day camps, ocean-side Y camps, canoe-trip camps, horseback camps, specialty camps, etc. However, it wasn't until my own kids went to FWF (back in 1981) and began to get interested in the arts that I ever thought seriously about what goes into a place like French Woods.

When you visit French Woods, the differences are the first thing that hit you. Throughout the day, you see children in groups of two or three perched on rocks, sitting at picnic tables or walking together. Some are with counselors, others are in peer groups. They hold books or instruments or paper, they are talking intensely, or declaiming the lines of a play; they're writing, or playing the saxophone. In the computer lab they are all busy with Macs. A group of standing boys lean together and try to hear one another as they master the harmonies of an acappella number. Everyone is trying to express themselves, everyone is trying to reach inside to create something: a piece of writing, a dance, the set for a play, a stand-up comedy routine, or an animated computer character.

At French Woods they believe in self-expression and self-reflection. Here, the children's interests drive the agenda. Where some camps have a central program with "electives" on the side, everything at French Woods is elective. There is no point in forcing musicians to try jewelry-making or hockey. It won't work. So, the mix of kids and their interests determines what is popular and what is offered. No two summers are alike. Some equipment is now obsolete, computer-assisted sound and light design is now a growing part of the theater program, and there is a new culinary workshop. The forms of artistic expression are constantly changing and French Woods is changing along with it.

At French Woods one can perform in a Broadway show with full orchestra, play another camp in any and all sports, participate in a swim meet, fly on the high trapeze, produce your own movie, record original music, make a stained glass window, ride a horse, dance in a ballet, play in the symphony orchestra, water ski or jam with a rock band and so much more. The enthusiasm for what they love and their willingness to take artistic risks pours out of our campers in this safe and supportive environment.
