Third Session Shows 2010!

The Aristocats (7-11 year olds)

Music and Lyrics by Richard M. Sherman and Robert B. Sherman and Al Rinker and Floyd Huddleston Music Adapted and Arranged and Additional Music and Lyrics by Bryan Louiselle Book Adapted and Additional Lyrics by Michael Bernard. This feline adventure is sure to get your audiences tapping their feet to its hep, jazzy beat, which includes the Disney favorites "The Aristocats," "Scales and Arpeggios" and "Ev'rybody Wants to Be a Cat."

Damn Yankees (7-11 year olds)

Music and lyrics by Richard Adler and Jerry Ross book by George Abbott and Douglas Wallop. Middle-aged baseball fanatic Joe Boyd trades his soul to the Devil for a chance to lead his favorite team to victory in the pennant race against the New York Yankees. As young baseball sensation Joe Hardy, he transforms the hapless Washington Senators into a winning team, only to realize the true worth of his life (and wife) he's left behind. This show will feature singing and dancing for ages

Where's Charley (7-11 year olds)

Book by George Abbott, Music by Frank Loesser What do you get when two musical theatre masters adapt one of the most popular and successful farces ever written? A tuneful and hysterically funny classic that's non-stop entertainment.

Where's Charley features many roles for younger performers, including Charley himself, an excellent opportunity for a young comic actor. The score by Frank Loesser includes the popular audience-participation hit "Once In Love With Amy," and the book by the legendary "Mr. Abbott" keeps things moving along at his trademark clip.

The Lion King (7-11 year olds)

Music by Elton John and lyrics by Tim Rice Celebrate "the circle of life" with Simba, Nala, Mufasa Rafiki, Timon, Pumba and the rest of the gang in this well loved musical for 7-11 year olds.

Pocahontis (7-11 year olds)

Book by Vera Morris, Music and lyrics by Scott Deturk. This enchanting musical is graced with a wonderful cast of characters: Little Running Rabbit, Brave Eagle, Aunt Morning Star, Forest Spirits, Mother Earth and, of course, the people of Jamestown. Filled with Native American lore and beautiful music, this play is true to the original legend. Audiences will be swept away with DeTurk's original music, featuring such songs as "Live Forever," "No Common Ground" and the beautiful "Your Heart Always Knows."

Lucky Stiff (11-14 year olds)

Tony Award winners Lynn Ahrens and Stephen Flaherty exploded on the musical theatre scene in 1988 with their first off-Broadway show, this zany, offbeat, and very funny murder mystery farce. The show, based on the novel "The Man Who Broke The Bank At Monte Carlo" by Michael Butterworth, is a classic musical farce, complete with slamming doors, mistaken identities, six million bucks in diamonds, and a corpse in a wheelchair.

Thoroughly Modern Millie (11-14 year olds)

Music and Lyrics by Jeanine Tesori and Dick Scanlan Book by Richard Henry Morris. Taking place in New York City in 1922, Thoroughly Modern Millie tells the story of young Millie Dillmount, who has just moved to the city in search of a new life for herself. It's a New York full of intrigue and jazz - a time when women were entering the workforce and the rules of love and social behavior were changing forever. Millie includes a full score of new songs and bright dance numbers.

Smile (11-14 year olds)

Music by Marvin Hamlisch and lyrics by Howard Ashman. Smile chronicles the backstage troubles of the fictional 1985 California Young American Miss beauty pageant held in Santa Rosa, California. The main characters include Robin Gibson and Doria Hudson, two contestants who

befriend and help each other throughout the week; Brenda DiCarlo Freelander, an ex-Young American Miss second-runner-up coordinating the pageant; and Brenda's husband Big Bob, an RV Salesman trying to help her through the week.

Hello Dolly (11-14 year olds)

Music and lyrics by Jerry Herman book by Michael Stewart. A matchmaker named Dolly Levi takes a trip to Yonkers, New York to see the "well-known unmarried half-a-millionaire," Horace Vandergelder. While there, she convinces him, his two stock clerks and his niece and her beau to go to New York City. In New York, she fixes Vandergelder's clerks up with the woman Vandergelder had been courting, and her shop assistant, so that Dolly can follow her designs on Mr. Vandergelder for herself.

La Cage aux Faux (11-17 year olds)

Book by Harvey Fierstein and lyrics and music by Jerry Herman. This musical focuses on a couple: Georges, the manager of his Saint-Tropez nightclub featuring drag entertainment, and Albin, his romantic partner and star attraction, and the farcical adventures that ensue when Georges' son, Jean-Michel, brings home his fiancée's ultra-conservative parents to meet them.

Candide (11-17 year olds)

Music and lyrics by Leonard Bernstein and Richard Wilbur, book by Lillian Hellman. In a baron's castle in Westphalia lived in extreme happiness, four young people: Cunegonde, the Baron's beautiful daughter; Maximilian, his equally beautiful son; Paquette, a very obliging serving girl; and Candide, an obscure bastard cousin. They had the great fortune to be instructed by that legendary philosopher Dr. Pangloss, who taught them that this is the best of all possible worlds and that everything that happens in it is for the best. There is, however, one slight flaw in this idyll...

Grand Hotel (11-17 year olds)

Book by Luther Davis Music and Lyrics by George Forrest and Robert Wright Additional Music and Lyrics by Maury Yeston. Come, spend a night or two in the world's most opulent, extravagant hotel. Perhaps you will find your fortune there, perhaps you will find true love, perhaps all of your dreams will come true...perhaps...

Jesus Christ Superstar (11-17 year olds)

Music and lyrics by Andrew Lloyd Webber Tim Rice A brilliantly conceived treatment of Christ's Passion, Rice and Webber's rock opera has gathered a world - wide reputation since its initial album release. It tells of the last week of Christ's life, culminating in his crucifixion and his follower's plaintive and searching cries for meaning in his death.

Electra (11-17 year olds)

A play by Sophocles. Set in the city of Argos a few years after the Trojan war, it is based around the character of Electra, and the vengeance that she and her brother Orestes take on their mother Clytemnestra and step father Aegisthus for the murder of their father, Agamemnon.

The Children's Hour (11-17 year olds)

A Play by Lillian Hellman. The Children's Hour premiered in New York at the Maxine Elliot Theatre, on November 20, 1934, with a cast of relatively unknown actors. The play was based on an essay the playwright had encountered titled "Closed Doors; or, The Great Drumsheugh Case." It related the true story of two female teachers who were condemned by their community when a student alleged that they were having a homosexual affair.

Harvey (11-17 year olds)
